# Defence Nuclear Enterprise - Our Locations

### 1. Ministry of Defence Head Office

Defence Nuclear Organisation central office.

#### 2. Navy Command Headquarters

Coordinates the various non-equipment components of the Enterprise (e.g. Training, personnel).

#### 3. AWE

Defence Nuclear Organisation location and nuclear warhead research, design, manufacture, assembly and decommissioning site.

#### 4. Bristol Abbey Wood

Defence Nuclear Organisation location and main site of the Submarine Delivery Organisation.

#### 5. Devonport Royal Dockyard

Operated by Babcock marine which stores and undertakes the maintenance and defueling of submarines.

#### 6. Raynesway

Rolls Royce site manufacturing nuclear powerplant cores for submarines.

#### 7. Barrow

BAE Systems shipyard manufacturing submarines.

## 8. Rosyth Dockyard

Babcock marine dockyard which stores and undertakes the decommissioning of nuclear submarines.

#### 9. Her Majesty's Naval Base Clyde

Including the operating base for UK submarines at Faslane and the armaments depot at Coulport where warheads are processed, loaded/unloaded on submarines and missiles can be stored.

#### **Outside of the UK**

DNO also operates in Valduc, France and part of the Teutates programme which runs out of Washington DC, USA.

# **Next Steps - Your Application**

To apply to our scheme, go to: <u>Civil Service Jobs</u>. Please note that this is an undergraduate scheme so if you have already graduated, you will not be eligible.

## To apply to this scheme, you must:

- Be a British National.
- Have graduated by 2027.
- Be willing to undertake compulsory paid 45-day work placements during the summer.
- Commit to working for the MoD for a minimum of 3 years following your graduation.
- Be studying for a degree in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths) as per the job advert.

## **Application Form:**

During the application process you will be assessed on Behaviours. Behaviours are part of the <u>Civil Service Success</u> <u>Profiles</u> recruitment framework, which we suggest fully understanding before applying. We recommend being specific with recent, real-life examples, utilising the Situation, Task, Action, Result (STAR) format.

- If you are successful at the application stage; Congratulations, one step closer to landing a career changing opportunity!
- Interviews will be virtual, carried out remotely via Microsoft Teams.
- Interview panels normally consist of recruiting managers and an independent panel member.
- Your ID will have to be shown to the camera before the interview can commence. Please avoid using blurred backgrounds during the interview.

# Next Steps - Onboarding and Vetting

## **Onboarding**

- Once you have received a provisional offer, your dedicated Defence Business Services (DBS) recruiter will send the relevant forms and documents for you to complete.
- Complete onboarding forms as soon as you receive them. Failure to return the forms in reasonable time may result in being withdrawn from the scheme.
- Checks cannot be bypassed or rushed and attempting to do so can delay other important onboarding activities.
- Once checks are complete, your DBS on-boarder will be in touch and a start date will be arranged.

### **Vetting**

- Vetting helps employers and employees identify, manage and mitigate risks for roles where national security concerns are a consideration, like jobs with access to high-risk sites, highly classified information or systems.
- You will be required to complete a Security Questionnaire, and will need to provide information about your background, family, employment history and where you've lived.
